Our first University Fair on September 11, 2025, marked a milestone in guiding students toward their higher education goals. With lively presentations and one on one conversations with representatives from twelve U.S. universities, including Centre College, Penn State University, Colby College, The Ohio State University, Allegheny College, Columbia College Chicago, Loyola University Maryland, Marshall University, The New School, University of New Hampshire, and Drexel University. Students explored diverse academic programs, scholarship options, and admission requirements.

Families also benefited from an informative session on college preparation, equipping them with practical strategies for navigating the application

process. The event was made possible through the support of WREN Tours, university admission officers, our counseling team, faculty, staff, and the enthusiasm of our students.

Throughout the semester, students engaged with international admission officers from institutions such as Nagoya University of Commerce and Business (Japan), Rutgers University, Indiana University Bloomington, Stevens Institute of Technology, Foothill + De Anza Community College (USA), University of British Columbia (Canada), and Imperial College London (UK). These sessions provided valuable insights into global university pathways, scholarship opportunities, and tailored advice for making informed decisions. 🇺🇸
