

General Announcements:



School hours

As a friendly reminder to all, students are to be in their classroom from 8:00 am to 3:30 pm. In the past, we have had a few students that had been late (tardy) arriving at school after 8:00 am. Also, we had some students not picked up at the end of the school day and the office was not aware of the reason. The students become a little anxious and as other students get to go home they become more and more restless. During this time we have some disciplinary issues. To eliminate potential problems, please make sure to pick up your children on time and if you are going to be late, please notify the office as to when you will pick them up.



Daily schedule: To help in having students in their assigned classroom we have initiated a 5 minute break between each period. This time will allow students to go to the restroom, get their drink, and prepare for the next class. Students will be under teacher supervision during this time to assure that they are getting prepared for their next class.





* Attendance records

All students are to clock-in when they arrive at school and clock-out when they leave, using their new Identification Cards. This new process will enhance the safety of our students as this will help us in case of emergencies such as fire or earthquake. Because of this requirement, all students must be dropped off and picked up through the main office. The students are to wait in the lobby until they are released to go home. Students should not cut across the parking lot from the covered area when they see their family car. As a reminder, the attendance record will be a part of the students' eligibility for honors and 'STARS' awards.



T Dress Code

Dominican International School Kaohsiung has a dress code and we expect our students to come to school in appropriate uniforms. Special days such as Spirit Days, Casual Fridays and holidays allow students to wear other non-uniform clothing. If you have any concerns please check the current Student/Parents handbook or ask the front office as to the correct dress code. Adhering to the Dress Code will be a part of the students' eligibility for honors and 'STARS' awards.



Standard notebooks:

Students can obtain new notebooks from the office. The DISK notebooks are available for each level. Having using standard notebooks will assist students' present their thoughts and material.



Parents-Teachers Orientation Day

Starting at 8:00, August 22, 2020, we will have a meet and greet time in the auditorium and after the morning prayer, parents will be escorted to the classroom to have an in-depth discussion on this coming year's curriculum and programs with the classroom teachers. Specialty teachers will be in their respective area in the library and present their curriculum for the year. At 10:00, parents will be invited back to the auditorium for a review and open discussion of the coming year. Dismissal will begin by 10:30 so teachers can have their reflective discussion and planning.



\star Flu Season

With the COVID-19 issue we are all aware of the needs to protect our students and ourselves. This reminds us that the Fall flu season will be starting soon. Flu spreads from person to person through coughing and sneezing, or contact with an infected person or contaminated object. You can lower your risk of being infected by

- ⇒ Washing your hands often with soap and water
- ⇒ Disinfecting dirty surfaces and soiled items
- ⇒ Avoiding close contact or sharing eating utensils or cups with infected people

We have asked our cleaning staff to thoroughly clean and disinfect surface areas and common contact items as doorknobs, handrails, and floors especially in kindergarten and lower elementary grades classrooms. However, it is also important to remind each student about the value of good healthy hygiene, starting with clean, laundered clothing, a good diet, drink plenty of water and get an adequate amount of sleep each night. If your child shows any symptoms of a cold or flu, it is better for them to stay home rather than spread the disease or having the symptoms get worse.

Until released by the Ministry of Education (MOE) and Central Disease Control (CDC) we will continue to measure the students temperature in the morning, sanitize hands with alcohol and suggest masks be worn while in the classroom or crowded area.



We require that the snacks students bring to school to be healthy. Processed cookies (sweet) or chips (high salt content) are not considered healthy. We encourage the students to bring fresh fruit or vegetables for snacks. In addition, to celebrate a student's birthday with a cake please plan on using the afternoon time to distribute.
