Course Description:

Reading and Phonics Kindergarten presents exciting theme lessons that combine phonics, reading, listening, comprehension, creative writing, and grammar. Students will use a variety of literary genres (short stories, poetry, folktales) to practice reading and learn new vocabulary. Reading comprehension and questioning techniques will be covered, as well as character development and author's purpose. This course incorporates phonics, English skills, service words, and word families. Pre-cursive handwriting skills will be taught to reinforce age-appropriate writing skills.

Course Requirements:

- The course will be conducted through lectures, discussions, practice material, projects, and student presentations. Students are strongly encouraged to raise questions and make comments in class. Participation is the key to success.
- Students are required to complete each assignment by the due date that is assigned. Staying on track with assignments will facilitate understanding of the class material.
- Students are encouraged to communicate concerns to teachers and ask for help as needed throughout the school year.
- Students are expected to organize their own class materials and to keep their work neat and tidy. Parents are encouraged to help students by labeling personal items with identification stickers with the student's name in English.
- Students will observe all school policies as outlined in the DISK Handbook. This includes arriving at school on time, abiding by the dress code, and speaking only English on the school grounds.
- Students will observe all school policies on Academic Honesty, as outlined in the DISK Handbook. All cases of academic misconduct (such as cheating on tests or plagiarism)

will automatically result in a "Fail" grade for the assignment, in addition to any sanctions that may be imposed by the School Discipline office.
