## **Course Description:**

The curriculum for grade three will draw on themes taught by our Campus Ministry. I also aim to create opportunities within the curriculum to draw on the School Wide Learning Outcome of *Active* for grade three. Introduction activities (which usually take place as whole-class activities) will draw on themes associated with this outcome. Students will also work towards a performance at the start of semester four during a Monday assembly.

#### **Course Requirements:**

- Structured small-group activities will be implemented using the Kagan Method
- A portion of the course will be conducted through practical exercises, discussions and presentations
- Students are strongly encouraged to raise their hands to contribute to class-wide scenarios.
- Students are required to participate as individuals and in their teams or with partners
- Classes during the first term will follow the structure of greetings, warm-up, improvisational activities and speech (in the form of short original poetry or prose)
- The fourth quarter will include in-class rehearsals, on-stage rehearsals (upon venue availability) and a performance during a Monday assembly
- Students will be given homework assignments throughout all semesters to complete it and one extra week with a verbal reminder before marks are submitted
- Students will be individually assessed on practical performances whether in small groups, with partners or during whole class performances
- Students are assessed every week for in-class participation

- Students are expected to read announcements on Google Classroom and encouraged to comment or share their own input whether privately (via e-mail) or publicly on the virtual feed
- Students are expected to be in class at the start of the period after five minute break, with water bottles filled up, and having already taken their bathroom break
- During the third term, students are expected to bring scissors, glue and color markers to Drama class. Should a student not have these items, the teacher will make the purchase on behalf of the student and request reimbursement

## **<u>Classroom Rules and Expectations:</u>**

- 1. Listen while another is talking, whether a teacher or fellow student
- 2. Respect for my own body, ears and voice
- 3. Respect for another's body, ears and voice
- 4. No touching without permission, and only when the activity requires it
- 5. Speak up if you are uncomfortable and write down the reason if you wish to not partake in a practical activity
