Course Description:

The Grade 6 Social Studies Course will be covering the topic of Human Geography. It aims to establish a basic understanding of the five major themes of geography as well as the different types of geography - human and physical. After establishing foundational knowledge, the course will then apply these concepts to the regions of the Eastern Hemisphere: Asia, Africa, and the Pacific. The class will delve into how geographical factors have helped shape historical and modern-day developments (political, social, and economic) in these regions and answer the fundamental question of why these developments exist in these regions. The course will help students to understand how broad developments in geography and history shaped the world we live in today.

Course Requirements:

The course will be conducted through lectures, discussions, practice material, projects and student presentations. In order to experience a successful outcome, students need to:

- ✓ Participate in class discussions, ask questions and contribute ideas, thoughts and opinions.
- ✓ Complete each assignment on time.
- ✓ Communicate concerns to teachers and ask for help when needed.
- ✓ Organize class materials and personal items.
- ✓ Keep the study environment neat and tidy.
- ✓ Observe all school policies as outlined in the DISK Parent-Student Handbook. This includes arriving at school on time, abiding by the dress code and speaking only English on the school grounds.
