Course Description:

The Grade 7 Social Studies Course will be covering the topic of Human Geography. It aims to build and expand upon the topics students studied in the sixth grade. After reviewing the foundational knowledge studied the previous year, as well as the geography of Europe and Northern Eurasia, we will delve into the regions of the Western Hemisphere: the US and Canada, Middle America, and South America. Students will study how geography helped to shape the history of these regions, and how this history affects the politics, society, and economics of the modern Western Hemisphere. The course will help students to understand how broad developments in geography and history shaped the world we live in today.

Course Requirements:

The course will be conducted through lectures, discussions, practice material, projects and student presentations. In order to experience a successful outcome, students need to:

- ✓ Participate in class discussions, ask questions and contribute ideas, thoughts and opinions.
- ✓ Complete each assignment on time.
- ✓ Communicate concerns to teachers and ask for help when needed.
- ✓ Organize class materials and personal items.
- √ Keep the study environment neat and tidy.
